1. Introduction

This briefing has been prepared in order to provide Primary Care Commissioning Committee (PCCC) with an overview of the work currently being discussed/progressed via the Primary Care Workstream Group (PCWG).

2. Primary Care Workstream Group (October 2018)

2.1 Primary Care Work programme highlight reports

Reports highlighting areas of concern (i.e. schemes that had been RAG rated as amber or red in the workplan) were provided to PCWG. These issues were discussed individually with actions agreed to progress where appropriate.

3. Performance Monitoring

3.1 Contractual Issues/Information

No contractual issues were raised/discussed

3.2 Contractual changes processed by NHSE (Appendix 1)

Information provided by NHS England was submitted to the Primary Care Workstream Group and is appended to this report for information.

3.3 5Quality Premium Indicators (QP)

Atrial Fibrillation (AF) 2 year target 2017-19 has already been achieved as reported at the last PCCC, work will continue to promote and encourage identification and diagnosis of AF via the Quality in Primary Care Contract as well as the Find and Treat workstream.

Antibiotic Prescribing 2018/19 a new specialist antibiotic pharmacist role is currently being scoped out.

GP Patient Survey 2018/19 - To earn this part of the QP, CCGs needs to demonstrate in the 2018 and 2019 publications, either:

- 85% of respondents who said they had a good experience of making an appointment, or;
- A 3 percentage point increase from the previous year publication on the percentage of respondents who said they had a good experience of making an appointment.

The latest survey results published in August 2018 (for January 2018 to March 2018) reveal that the CCG average for 'overall experience of making an appointment' in 2018 decreased by 3%, meaning, the CCG did not achieve the 2017/18 QP target.

It is however worth noting that the national average also decreased by 4% in 2018, meaning the CCG still scored above the national average for this indicator

To increase our chances of achieving this year's quality premium target an action plan has been developed to increase patient satisfaction levels and increase awareness of the survey across Bury and will involve:

- A communication campaign to increase patient satisfaction levels by raising awareness of the primary care offer available to patients in Bury ahead of the 2018 survey
- A communication campaign in the weeks leading up to the survey to raise general public awareness of the surveys availability and its importance
- Provision of a tool kit for GP practices containing resources to assist them in promoting the primary care offer and raising awareness of the survey with their patients
- Targeted work with outlying practices through their primary care quality visits

1.2 PMS update

Position confirmed nothing further to update; the PMS position is fully complete across Bury practices.

1.3 APMS update position

This information was presented previously and remains unchanged. Procurement successfully concluded for two APMS sites, Moorgate and Radcliffe. One contract awarded for service provision across both sites with effect from 1st April 2017. This will be provided by Rock Healthcare, on a 10 year term with an option to extend for a further 5 years with funding equitable to GMS. The database merge for the contracts has now been finalised and are operating under The Rock Y02755)

1.4. Remedial breach notices

There have been no remedial or breach notices issued during the reporting period.

1.5 CQC update

There have been no published CQC reports issued during the reporting period.
